Our Lord invites to his table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood contrary to that which is stated above do so to their great harm. (1Cor 11:17-34) Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar. Anyone who is not yet instructed, who is in doubt, or who hold a confession different than the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and desire to receive the sacrament, are asked to speak with Pastor before taking communion. Those not communing are still invited to come forward for a blessing from the Pastor, by crossing their arms over their chest.



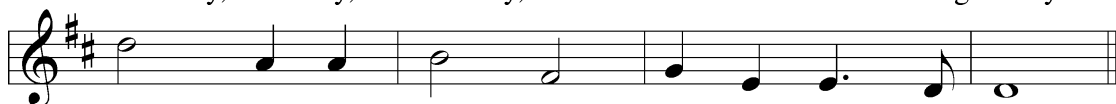


